

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR ACADEMIC EXCHANGE AND
COOPERATION
BETWEEN
CAMBODIA ACADEMY OF DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY, CAMBODIA
AND
BURAPHA UNIVERSITY, THAILAND

Cambodia Academy of Digital Technology (“CADT”), Cambodia, and Burapha University (“BUU”), Thailand, with the objective of facilitating mutual friendship, academic research and educational cooperation between the two institutions, hereby conclude this MOU.

Article 1. This MOU covers the exchange of graduate students which will occur on a regular basis.

Article 2. Unless otherwise defined, “exchange” shall mean a one-for-one exchange of students from each university; “exchange students” shall mean students participating in the exchange implemented herein; “sending university” shall mean the student’s home university from which he or she intends to graduate; and “receiving university” shall mean the university that has agreed to receive the exchange students from the sending university; “program” shall mean the exchange program or the research projects or activities.

Article 3. Suitable candidates for exchange programs will be recommended by the sending university. The receiving university will review their academic records and recommendations to determine their eligibility for a particular program.

Article 4. Both universities agree to only accept students who do not seek degrees at the receiving university.

Article 5. Expenses incurred by exchange students in programs under this MOU, except for expenses covered by Article 6, will be borne by the individual student unless financial fund is available. Both institutions shall try its effort to find financial fund available for the exchange students. In principle, the sending university or its exchange students shall be responsible for the costs associated with illness or disaster happening to the students themselves. As a means to prepare for these unexpected events, the sending university shall assist the students to sign up for appropriate insurance coverage that is valid during their study at the receiving university.

Article 6. The receiving university will waive application, registration and tuition fees. Each exchange student will pay for his/her travel, meals and accommodation unless financial fund is available in receiving university.

Article 7. The MOU allows up to (three(3)) students to study at the receiving university for a period of up to 12 months on an annual basis. Both universities will review the program annually for any imbalances in the number of exchange students and make an effort to maintain a reasonable balance in the number of exchange students. Both universities will endeavor to make the number of exchange students equal by the end of the MOU.

Article 8. Prospective exchange students shall satisfy the English language proficiency and requirements of each program. Exchange students are expected to return to the sending university upon completion of the exchange program.

Article 9. The sending university will recognize credits, awarded by the receiving university according to the regulations and practices of the sending university.

Article 10. Each university will, within the limits of their resources, assist exchange students covered under the terms of this MOU in securing accommodations and in achieving their study and research goals.

Article 11. This MOU takes effect when it is signed by both parties. The MOU is to remain in effect for (five(5)) years from the date it is signed and is renewed by the mutual written consent of the parties unless terminated sooner as provided herein.

Article 12. The MOU may be modified by mutual written consent of both parties. Any agreed modification during the validity period of this MOU shall be made as annex to this MOU.

Article 13. The MOU may be terminated by either university with notification to the other party at least (six(6)) months prior to the effective date of termination. The termination of the MOU will not affect the terms of activities ongoing at the time of notification of termination unless otherwise agreed between the parties.
